The Gold Rush music festival did not have recycling services set up for their 20,000 attendee event. At a large event such as this, it is challenging to ensure low contamination levels. These challenges presented the opportunity to divert **100 lbs** of waste from the landfill over that weekend.

Our team was responsible for the overall success of the recycling effort at the festival. In order for the event to run smoothly, our responsibilities included:

- Volunteer recruitment
- Set up and take down of bins
- Volunteer coordination, scheduling, and onsite logistics
- Bin guarding, maintenance, hauling, and materials sorting to ensure low levels of contamination
- Volunteer supplies provision

BENEFITS TO PROJECT PARTNER

Our efforts, from volunteer coordination to tear down, diverted over **100 lbs** of resources from the landfill. This improves the company's positive brand perception and created a blueprint for how they can continue to recycle moving forward.

We benefited by gaining an understanding of the necessary steps to divert waste from events. As businesses are now expected to become more sustainable, understanding how to coordinate a waste diversion program is a valuable skill set.
